

Dear Parishioners,

One of the best reasons to read scripture is that it teaches us how to pray. Many of us struggle with prayer. How do we approach God? What do we say to Him? What can we even ask for that we hope to gain? How does man close the vast distance between him and his God by the mere utterances of his lips and the affections of the heart?

Scripture shows, in the various presented examples of prayerful persons, who to align body and soul, heart, mind, and lips in supplication to the Creator. Humility is the first step. If one is to approach God in prayer, one must approach with humility. This is how God welcomes us into His presence. He will not turn away the humble: "A humble and contrite heart, O God, you will not spurn (Psalm 51)."

The utterly humble and simple prayer of the tax collector is presented to us by Christ as a model for prayer. While other more elaborate, more eloquent expressions can arise from this point, the bedrock and foundation of our prayer must always be the posture of humility. If we start anywhere else, our prayer is doomed to become vain, disoriented, distracted. We have to begin in prayer always with an admission of our profound need, our insufficiency, our reliance at all times upon the providence of God.

This is why the Eastern Catholic/Orthodox "rosary" or "chotki" contains the multiple repetitions of what is known now as "the Jesus prayer": "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner." We always have to return to the basics, even if we manage to ascend the highest heights of meditation.

The process of re-humbling ourselves, even daily, is a necessary process of reorientation as we continually lose ourselves in prideful thoughts and actions. This is how we return to the Father: Much like the case with the prodigal son, the path of humility always brings us back home.

Hear what the late Pope Francis had to say about Our Gospel passage from Luke's Gospel and the prayer of the tax collector from his General Audience of June 1st, 2016: "If God prefers humility, it is not to dishearten us: rather, humility is the necessary condition to be raised by Him, so as to experience the mercy that comes to fill our emptiness. If the prayer of the proud does not reach God's heart, the humility of the poor opens it wide. God has a weakness for the humble ones. Before a humble heart, God opens his heart entirely. It is this humility that the Virgin Mary expresses in the Canticle of the Magnificat: "he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden... His mercy is on those who fear him from generation to generation" (Lk 1:48, 50). Let her help us, our Mother, to pray with a humble heart. And we, let us repeat that beautiful prayer three times: "Oh God, be merciful to me a sinner."

How has our pride distanced ourselves from God? From others? Are we afraid of being humbled? Not just before God, but in front of others? Can we bear to be proven wrong, or bear wrongs patiently? Has pride kept us from apologizing, or offering forgiveness? Has it kept us from seeking forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession, where humility and mercy meet in a profound, and beautiful way? Can we admit to ourselves, to God, to the priest, that we are in fact sinners?

Stay humble my friends! "With pride comes disgrace, but with humility there is wisdom (Proverbs 11:2)."


