

Dear Parishioners,

I want to thank those of you who have already updated your giving in response to the Increased Offertory Parish Campaign. Some of you have responded very generously. But many parishioners, sadly have not responded at all. In fact, those who haven't responded are, in many cases, those who have not been giving currently. And it is to those who have not been giving in particular that I address this note.

On the one hand, we all have expectations of the Church: The Church, like any institution we benefit from, provides goods and services. The Church should also provide a priest whenever we need one, for Mass, confessions, counseling, sacramental preparation, Christian burial, anointing of the sick, communion calls etc. etc. The Church should also be a center of community activity and serve as the host for community functions, the most important of these being the Sacred Liturgy.

We want our church to give to us. Can we reasonably expect this without giving back?

St. Paul, in innumerable places in the New Testament, compares the Church to "the Body of Christ (see Colossians 1:8, Ephesians 1:22, etc.)." How is a body supposed to function when some of its parts are numb? The head may want to go somewhere, but if the feet are asleep, the body won't go far!

I don't want to criticize those who are already giving and have pledged to give more. The difficulty is with those who are not giving at all. I don't want to be mean, but I do have to be frank. This is a problem. And it is a problem that these parishes face in a profound way compared with other parishes. As I have alluded to before, I would not have been approached by the Diocese to start this campaign if we weren't having issues!

I want to encourage you, as a father to his children, as to the importance of giving and "giving back." I once overheard my own father speaking to his younger brother on this subject. My uncle Scott was asking my dad for advice on raising his own children. My dad told him that one of the most important things he tried to instill into his children was the concept of "giving back."

This left a lasting impression on me. For this reason, I have quoted to you often the Psalm which is closest to my heart: "How can I make a return to the Lord, who has done so much for me?... I will sacrifice and make my offering to you (Psalm 116)."

God wants to do much for us. The Church wants to do much for us too. I personally would like to do much for you. But we need your help. These parishes, which I have come to love, and which are God's chosen instruments for the sanctification of His people in Monroe County, need your help. I know that the Diocese and the parishes often operate imperfectly, and are led by imperfect people. For many people, this is often cited as an excuse to withhold support, along with other grievances real or perceived. But our Lord, who Himself criticized the temple elite, also praised the example of the poor widow who gave money for the temple's upkeep (Mark 12:41-44). In light of Our Lord's example, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, as one of the precepts of the Church, "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to his abilities (CCC 2043)."

It's your church, folks. If you want to keep it, you gotta keep it up.
