



Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus, Our Lord,

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. This mystery is remembered in the fourth Luminous Mystery of the Holy Rosary. The Luminous Mysteries are generally prayed on Thursdays according the schedule that Pope St. John Paul II devised when he gave us these mysteries. And so each week we have the opportunity to meditate on this beautiful episode in Our Blessed Lord's life that occurred right before His sorrowful passion and death. Seeing Jesus transfigured in glory and revealing His divine nature must have been truly awesome for the chosen apostles: Peter, James, and John. As we reflect on this mystery at today's Liturgy let us also be reminded that those who make it into eternal glory with God will also be transfigured and will shine like the sun for all eternity. We will participate in God's own divine nature and this is truly amazing.

This Sunday is also the day of the annual picnic at St. John's. The picnic will start right after the 10:30 a.m. Mass. It is a fun-raiser and needs everyone's support. It takes many people to put this picnic on each year and we are grateful for all those who prepared food and other items for this event as well as those who sold raffle tickets and planned the whole affair. And thanks to all those who will be working at the picnic serving the food and cleaning up afterwards. May God reward each and every one of you.

Our Mass schedule and adoration on Wednesday is as normal this week. But, please don't forget to vote this Tuesday on the issue of changing the Ohio Constitution. Vote yes to make it more difficult to change it. I put some material in the vestibule at St. Sylvester's and we have been putting some information in our bulletin regarding this issue. Let us do all we can to protect the lives of unborn babies from those who would destroy these innocent people even up to the time of delivery.

We continue with some readings from the little book entitled: JESUS OUR EUCHA-RISTIC LOVE by Fr. Stephano Manelli. During this time of Eucharistic revival called for by our bishops let us meditate on these words from Fr. Manelli's book:

"What shall we say about the delicacy of the saints in regard to the Eucharistic Species? They had uncompromising faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in even the smallest visible fragment of a Host. It suffices merely to have seen St. Pio to realize with what conscientious care he purified the paten and the sacred vessels at the altar. Adoration could be read on his face."

The altar boy carries the paten as the priest distributes our Lord's Sacred Body and Blood and he puts it under the chin of each communicant so that if even the smallest particle of the Host should fall it will land on the paten. Then, after the distribution of the Eucharist the priest carefully cleans the paten brushing any particles into the chalice and then consumes the contents. How very fortunate we are to be able to receive the life-giving Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of the risen Son of God in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist!!! And to think that we can do so every day if our schedule allows. Receiving Him often draws us ever closer to God and makes us more and more like our Savior.
