Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As we travel through this holy season of Advent our hearts await with growing anticipation the solemn Feast of Christmas. Our desire is that Christ be born anew in our hearts and in the hearts of the whole world. The terrible tragedy of war and the suffering of so many people who do not have enough to eat and drink rightly distresses us. Our Christmas wish is that there be peace among the nations and a deep respect for the dignity of every human being. The fact that God chose to assume our mortal nature is a profound statement of our inherent goodness. God created our nature so that it would be compatible with His divine nature. We rejoice in the fact that He wants us to share eternal happiness with Him. And so the birth of Christ has so many implications concerning our dignity that we could spend much time contemplating this great mystery of our faith. And indeed this season of Advent affords us that opportunity if we slow down and look for quiet time in our busy lives.

Our Blessed Mother reflected profoundly on the mystery of Christ and as disciples of the Lord Jesus we too should reflect on Him Who is our Life and our Salvation. Advent is a Marian season because She gave Him his human nature. She was prepared by God in a special way to be the God-bearer of our salvation. And so even from her very conception she was kept free from the contagion of sin that every human being inherits on coming into this world. She is the Immaculate Conception and we honor her this Thursday, December 8th as we celebrate this great Feast which is a holy day of obligation. Our special Mass schedule will be as follows: On Wednesday evening, December 7th our Mass will be at 6:00 p.m. at St. Sylvester's following the all day Eucharistic Adoration that we have each Wednesday. Usually the Mass is at 6:30 p.m. but this Wednesday it will be at 6:00 p.m. The Eucharist will be reposed about ten minutes before the Mass starts. On Thursday, December 8th we will have the school Mass at 8:30 a.m. and then finally at 6:00 p.m. we will have Mass at St. John the Baptist. And so there are three Masses scheduled for the Holy Day of Obligation.

On Saturday, December 10th there will be a special Latin Traditional Mass offered at 7:00 a.m. at St. Sylvester's. It is called the "rorate caeli" Mass celebrating Mary as the dawn of our salvation. The Mass is celebrated with candle light and begins when it is still dark outside. Then, as the Mass progresses and the morning sky begins to light up we are reminded that Mary brought into the world Christ Who is the Light of the world. The Mass will be sung in Latin but of course the readings will be read in English at the time of the homily. A missal is very helpful since it has all of the prayers and readings translated into English side by side with the Latin. I have a couple of new missals if anyone is interested in purchasing one. Following the Mass there will be a pot luck breakfast in the basement of St. Sylvester's.

May the Lord bless each and every one of you as you continue the journey to Christmas. May He be born anew in our lives.
