



Dear Parishioners,

It is very hard sometimes not to get caught up in the news cycle, which can often depress and frustrate us more than actually inform us, but I can't help but be shaken by all the violence happening around us in our country, with the school shooting in Minneapolis, to the bus stabbing in Charlotte, and now the assassination of conservative pundit Charlie Kirk.

The increase of violence is a sad but predictable outcome of the polarization of our society. It is also the result, I firmly believe, of the abandonment of faith.

Our Country was established on rational principles: limited government, responsible use of freedom, freedom of expression and belief. But our country was established also on principles which were enshrined in Christianity long before they were written in our Constitution, such as the belief in the dignity of every human being, the importance of love of neighbor, the essential requirements of mercy and justice.

As was sadly discovered our ancient progenitors in faith, i.e. the Israelites, there are consequences for abandoning God. This isn't just on account of God's wrath: the simple truth is, if we remove God from society, our society will collapse.

I think we are witnessing a great deal with this, not just in society, but also in its microcosm, the family. We wonder why families are so disjointed and dysfunctional, but no one thinks to blame the lack of prayer, the lack of faith, the lack of reverence, the lack of appreciation for even basic duties with regard to worship. We have taken God for granted, or otherwise have chosen to live without Him. Should we be surprised when all around us is chaos?

And yet in the midst of chaos, Christ calls us to be a light in the darkness. He never promised us an easy go of life; on the contrary! He told us to be salt and light to the world; that He was sending us out as lambs among wolves, and that we would have to carry our crosses after Him.

On this Sunday the Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross, let us pray that Christ's own example of selfless love demonstrated on the Cross may be our inspiration for loving and serving others as well, especially in the face of murderous hatred and persecution.

"Lord Jesus Christ, who are called the Prince of Peace, who are Yourself our peace and reconciliation, who so often said, 'Peace to you' - please grant us peace. Make all men and women witnesses of truth, justice and brotherly love. Banish from their hearts whatever might endanger peace. Enlighten our rulers that they may guarantee and defend the great gift of peace. May all peoples of the earth become as brothers and sisters. May longed-for peace blossom forth and reign always over us all". - Prayer for peace, Pope St. John XXIII
