Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of my constant prayers for our communities here in Monroe County is the return to the faith of fallen away Catholics. We should never give up no matter how long our loved ones have been away from the Faith. By our power we cannot convert anyone. But, nothing is impossible for God. Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is particularly efficacious for our time. Our Lady at Fatima made it very clear that we can help save many souls from hell by our sacrifices and prayers. She said that many souls go to hell because they have no one to pray for them and offer sacrifices for their conversion. It is not enough to simply 'hope' our loved ones will return to the state of grace and be able to receive worthily the sacraments of the Church we must also formulate concrete resolutions and carry them out faithfully, for the rest of our lives if necessary.

I came across a brochure recently outlining a plan of action for the salvation of our loved ones:

- 1. Offer our daily rosary for them
- 2. Offer five first Saturdays for them
- 3. Offer short prayers throughout the day.
- 4. Consecrate them to the Immaculate Heart of Mary
- 5. Perform sacrifices or acts of charity regularly.
- 6. Offer Masses for them
- 7. Give them a Brown Scapular (or place a green scapular in their home.
- 8. Offer the nine First Fridays for them

Several months ago or perhaps longer I suggested that we each do some penance on Fridays and I mentioned fasting from one meal and not eating meat and to do so specifically for the conversion of fallen away Catholics from our parish and families. I think some of you have been faithfully doing so and already there are good results. I encourage us all to help in this effort to save souls from eternal damnation. The worst possible thing that could happen to anyone would be the eternal loss of one's soul. "O my Jesus forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell and lead all souls to heaven especially those most in need of Thy mercy."

Bible Study

The Bible study starts this Monday, January 17th right after the 5:30 p.m. Mass at St. Sylvester's. The study will take a look at the Church Fathers and how they shaped the way we read scripture. We usually begin with a light snack and then watch a video followed by a short discussion. Everyone is invited to come. The group will continue to meet for about 12 sessions.
