

Dear parishioners,

Having lived now in world for some years and having hopefully obtained some wisdom along the way, you will have discerned that the world is full of many attractive, comforting, and at the same time utterly deceptive lies. Some of these lies are heresies, which many have either formally adopted as truths of the faith, or just casually assumed to be true (because it's easy).

The heresy of Universalism (namely, that all people will go to heaven) is attractive to us because it seeks to dispense us from the Apostolic exhortation of St. Paul to "work out your salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12)." It also seeks to dispense with the image of Christ as Lord and Judge, which is a role which Jesus repeatedly assumes for Himself in the Gospel. Universalism allows us to do whatever we want, rather than to do what pleases our Lord and live lives in imitation of the saints. It is diametrically opposed to the message Jesus teaches us: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough (Luke 13:24)."

Heaven is simply not for everyone. Sorry to burst your bubble! It's actually quite an exclusive club: saints only! In order to reach up to God who reaches down to us requires of us great love, unshakeable faith – and indomitable strength.

Thank you, Jesus! You have shared with us a secret for obtaining Heaven. You want us to come to eternal life, and you have the goodness to tell us we must have strength to do it! Heaven is, after all, a fortress of strength: ruled by an omnipotent God, its narrow gate is guarded by terrifying angelic beings, and its streets are populated with the brave and the bold, the saints of God! Jesus isn't strictly speaking about physical strength – although we do need sufficient fortitude to resist the bodily temptations of impurity, laziness, and gluttony. In addition, we need also the strength to do good rather than to do nothing, the strength to love rather than to hate, the strength to endure much suffering rather than capitulate to trials and temptation.

Christ expects much from us in this life. This will require great strength, but Christ readily strengthens us with His grace in the Sacraments. With the additional fortitude that comes from meditation on the Word of God, the beautiful devotional prayers of the Church, and familiarity with the saints and angels, what is lacking to us? We Catholics have the whole spiritual gymnasium available to us: the Sacraments, the prayers, the writings and biographies of the saints, the spiritual and corporal works of mercy... None of us have any excuse to be wimpy!

None of us have any excuse to be a soft, weak, unfaithful Christian because we have a God who gives strength in abundance (He is so good!). These past few days, my mind has been resting upon this verse from the Prophet Isaiah, which many of you might be familiar with: "He gives power to the faint, abundant strength to the weak. Though young men faint and grow weary, and youths stagger and fall, they that hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar on eagles' wings; they will run and not grow weary, walk and not grow faint (Isaiah 40:29-30)."

May God strengthen you in every struggle, and by the help of His grace, and the help He gives to weary souls, may He lead you safely into the Kingdom of His rest.
