



Dear parishioners,

This week's scripture carries on a theme which was begun last week, that is, the problem of material possessions and wealth. Jesus who said to us last week "You cannot serve both God and mammon" shows us how the worship of wealth leads to slavery to it. The "ivory couch" becomes a trap for those who seek too much solace in comfort; the "fine linen" a net to ensnare those enamored by opulence.

Ultimately, hell is what becomes of those utterly obsessed with material things. I didn't come up with that! Jesus clearly says so in the Gospel (Luke 16:19-31)! Jesus is trying to teach us that wealth is very deceptive: it may comfort us now, but it cannot secure for us life eternal.

Psalm 49 is particularly instructive on this issue: "No man can pay to God the ransom of his soul... indeed, the wise and the fool both die together and leave their wealth to others... Do not fear then when a man becomes rich, when the wealth of his house grows great. At his death he will not take along anything, his glory will not go down after him... In his wealth, man lacks wisdom. He is like the beasts – they perish."

Wealth is very deceptive. There is no lasting security in it. Like the foolish man who built up larger barns to store his produce (Luke 12:16-21), we can get a false sense of security from riches. The comfort that money buys us can blind us as well: It can blind us to our own spiritual needs, and it can blind us to the needs of ours.

Jesus holds the rich man personally responsible for the death of poor Lazarus. He ought to have been his brother's keeper! Because of his gross opulence, he becomes negligent to the needs of others, and himself becomes a murderer.

We are warned repeatedly of the dangers of wealth. Greed is one of the seven deadly sins for a reason; it begets all sorts of daughter vices: defrauding others, covetousness, negligence of the poor, and many others.

Practicing generosity, liberality, and charity to the poor and those in need are important for maintaining a spirit of detachment from the things of earth which can become very enticing. Fasting, abstinence, and practicing detachment is helpful for learning to not rely too heavily on worldly comforts.

If you have a hard time giving, ask yourself: Am I too attached to money? Do I have a hard time trusting that God will take care of me? Is attachment to wealth (or the pursuit of it) sometimes the cause of rifts in the life of my family (or community)?

To live fully and freely the Christian life, we have to depend entirely on Jesus and give of ourselves freely to others. This can't be accomplished while we are slaves to Mammon.
