

Dear Friends in Christ,

Here we are at the end of July already. This Tuesday begins the month of August. Where did the summer go? Of course it's not quite over yet so we can still enjoy a few more weeks until school starts.

Our Mass schedule this week and adoration on Wednesday is as normal. Please consider coming to some daily Masses and praying for the Church and the world as well as other important things. We would really like to see you there. This coming Friday is the First Friday and so our Mass will be at 7:00 p.m. followed by a Holy Hour of Adoration and Reparation at St. Sylvester's. Our Lord promised those who make it to Mass on nine First Fridays in a spirit of reparation that He would grant them the grace of final repentance and entrance into eternal life when they die. And then this coming Saturday is the First Saturday so our Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. followed by a pot luck breakfast with delicious food. Our Lady at Fatima promised those who faithfully on the First Saturday of five consecutive months pray the rosary, assist at Holy Mass, and spend 15 or 20 minutes in her company while meditating on one or more mysteries of the rosary all in the spirit of reparation for the sins committed against her Immaculate Heart that she would see to it that they receive the grace of salvation when they die. She also said that confession should be part of the First Saturday reparation but it need not be done on the Saturday itself. It should be done within a week or so before the First Saturday or even afterwards. I don't know about vou but I think these promises are very important and I for one am grateful to God for this help to our salvation.

We will have our monthly Knights of Columbus Meeting on Wednesday evening right after the 6:30 p.m. Mass. Hopefully all the Knights will see this announcement and attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass this Wednesday evening as well as attend the meeting afterwards in the basement. We need the witness of courageous Knights filled with zeal for the Catholic faith. If you would like to join the Knights of Columbus please fill out an application and return it to me. The applications are in the vestibule of both St.Sylvester's and St. John's Churches. We would love to have you if you are a practicing Catholic man.

I would like to review with everyone the conditions for a worthy reception of the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. First and foremost one must be free from mortal sin, in other words one must be in a state of grace. Even one instance of deliberately missing Mass on a Sunday or Holy Day of obligation constitutes a mortal sin and must be confessed before one may receive Holy Communion worthily. Any grave offense against God constitutes a mortal sin. Sexual acts outside of marriage for example are always gravely sinful and must be confessed before one can receive worthily Our Blessed Lord's Body and Blood. Any grave sin that breaks any of the ten commandments is a mortal sin. When one receives Holy Communion unworthily one receives Communion to one's own condemnation. It is called a sacrilege. A mortal sin is a grave offense against Almighty God and must be deliberately committed with full knowledge that it is a mortal sin in order for one to be guilty of this sin. Please go to confession regularly in order to stay always in a state of grace.
