Labor Day

I hope that everyone is having a nice Labor Day Weekend. The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated locally in New York City on Tuesday, September 5, 1882. But then 13 workers twelve years later during the Pullman Strike in June of 1894 were killed thus prompting President Grover Cleveland to make reconciliation with the Labor movement a top political priority and Labor day became a federal holiday in that same year of 1894. And so it has been celebrated nationally for over 100 years. Labor Day presents us with the opportunity as Catholic Christians to seek true and just wages and working conditions for all workers and to invoke often the powerful prayers of St. Joseph, Patron saint of workers for all those who are in search of work. Since most businesses are closed on Labor Day families have an opportunity to enjoy a day off from school and work and a time to be refreshed.

Youth Group

This coming Tuesday, September 7th we will have our first Youth Group Meeting for 7th through 12th graders. The meeting will be held in the basement of the St. Sylvester Church from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Regina Knox will be the Youth Group Co-coordinator.
