Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Feast of the Most Blessed Trinity!! I pray that the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit dwell in each of our souls and bring our Christian lives to resplendent holiness. At St. John the Baptist Church this weekend Harrison Christman will be receiving for the first time the Body and Blood of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in his First Holy Communion!! Congratulations to Harrison's family and thanks to Eileen Ackerman for teaching and preparing him for this important day. With Baptism and First Holy Communion Harrison is even more fully initiated into the Christian mystery. When he gets to fifth grade he can begin preparations for the Sacrament of Confirmation. With God's help he will receive Holy Communion and Penance/Reconciliation regularly in his Catholic life and grow to full maturity in Christ. Let us say a prayer for him and his family this day.

At St. John the Baptist this week the Church will complete 121 years since it was first dedicated back in 1902 on June 8th. I wish we had some pictures of that day to display in the Church. June 8th falls on a Thursday this year which is perfect since that is the day I generally have Mass at St. John's at 9:00 a.m. following the Holy Hour of Adoration. And so I will celebrate the Mass of the Dedication of a Church and after Mass there will be a light reception in the parish Hall. Everyone is welcome! Just think of all the people who have passed through the doors of our Church and some for marriage, others for First Communion, others for the Sacrament of Confession or for Confirmation and of course some to be buried. A church building is a very sacred place of encounter with God and so the day of the dedication should always be remembered in a special way by the Catholic community that meets in that sacred building. Please try to come on Thursday to give thanks to God for the beautiful church of St. John the Baptist.

The Feast of Corpus Christi will be next Sunday and since we are in a special time of Eucharistic Revival we are planning an extended time of adoration that will lead us to that Feast of Corpus Christi. On Friday, June 9th I will expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration after the 8:30 a.m. Mass at St. Sylvester. Adoration will then continue all day Friday and through the night as well and all day on Saturday, June 10th until the 5:00 p.m. Mass. There are people who have signed up to be present during all of those hours. We must never leave the Eucharist unattended when it is exposed on the altar. After the 5;00 p.m. Mass on June 10th we will have a Eucharistic Procession down Main Street (walking on the sidewalk) and when we get to the caution light we will turn right and go down to the feed store. The procession will be led by the person carrying the cross accompanied by two candle bearers. Then I will be carrying the monstrance containing the Most Precious Body of the Lord with someone accompanying me carrying an umbrellino, which is a liturgical umbrella that is only used when the Eucharist is carried in procession. Following me will be the children who have received their First Holy Communion this year wearing their white and also the young people who received Confirmation this year wearing what they wore on the day of their Confirmation. Then the children from the school wearing their uniforms accompanied by their families. After them will come all the other children and young people who attend other schools in the area and finally after them will come the Knights of Columbus wearing shirt and tie and the women who make up the women's groups in both parishes. I have already spoken to the children of the school and have been trying to get everyone excited about this procession. There will be four altars set up along the route and at each altar the Eucharist will be placed upon it for a few minutes as prayer is offered. Then the procession will continue and we will enter the Church where Benediction will be prayed and then the Eucharist reposed in the tabernacle. Corpus Christi processions have been going on for centuries and it is an opportunity to take our Catholic faith in the Holy Eucharist into the streets to perhaps draw non-Catholics into our holy beliefs. But most importantly the procession and adoration are meant to help us as Catholics give due honor and thanksgiving to God for the miraculous Gift of the most Holy Eucharist, Our Lord's true Body and Blood.

I hope that everyone will have a great week.
