Steubenville Priests' Retirement Plan

– On the weekend of February 4th & 5th, we will have the first-ever collection for the Steubenville Priests' Retirement Plan. This is an effort to help the Plan to become fully funded. Please be mindful that this is a new and distinct collection from the Collection for Retired Religious. The Collection for Retired Religious that was taken up in December is specifically for Sisters and Brothers belonging to religious orders. The priests of our diocese receive no benefit whatsoever from that collection. We have opted to initiate an annual collection specifically for the retirement plan to which our diocesan priests belong. We face the same dilemma as religious communities - namely more elderly priests entering retirement and fewer younger priests still in ministry generating support for the retirement plan. There are envelopes for the Steubenville Priests' Retirement Plan in your envelope packets as well as some available in the vestibule of the church and the parish office. Please be generous to this collection to help support those who have given a lifetime of service in the parishes of the Diocese of Steubenville. Dear Friends in Christ,

This week our daily Masses will follow the normal schedule at both St. Sylvester's and St. John's. I hope you can join us as often as possible to receive the Bread of Life and listen to God's word.

In a couple of weeks we will be starting the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday is February 22nd. On that day all who are 18 to 59 inclusive are required to fast. Fasting on Ash Wednesday means eating only one full meal. Two snacks that don't equal another meal may be taken as well. This might be an apple or a piece of toast or something similar. Also those who are at least 14 years of age and older are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

It is a tradition that on the Fridays of Lent the Catholic community prays the Stations of the Cross. We will do so every Friday of Lent at 6:00 p.m. at St. Sylvester's. The Knights of Columbus will offer a Fish dinner starting at 4:30 p.m. on February 24th, March 10th, and March 24th at St. Sylvester's. The Church will be open on those days starting at 4:30 p.m. so that after the meal people can go to the Church and pray and wait for the Stations of the Cross to begin at 6:00 p.m. I was disappointed last year because there were not many people who prayed the Stations. I am hoping that we do better this year.

Lent is a time to reflect on the goodness of God and His infinite love for sinners. It is a time of penance and prayer imitating Our Lord's 40 day fast and prayer in the desert as He began His sacred public ministry. For those who are preparing to enter the Church at Easter it is a special time to try to live as completely as possible the life of a committed Christian. The Church should be praying for these people and showing them a good example.

This time of "pre-Lent" is a time for each of us to carefully consider how we are going to observe this holy time. It is a time of renewal for the Christian community and for each of us individually. It should include a good confession at some point or perhaps a couple of times during the Lenten season. It should also include the voluntary sacrifices we wish to make and the prayer routine that we intend to follow. We are preparing for the greatest Liturgical Feast of the entire year, that of Easter. Our preparation should be sincere and heartfelt so that we can more worthily arrive at that great Feast.

This quote from Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity seems appropriate as we prepare for Lent: "For my heart is always with Him, day and night it thinks unceasingly of its heavenly and divine Friend, to whom it wants to prove its affection. Also within it arise this desire: not to die, but to suffer long, to suffer for God, to give Him its life while praying for poor sinners."
