Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here we are at the end of October already. This looks like a quiet week. This Sunday is World Mission Sunday and hopefully all of us will contribute to the ongoing mission of the Church to evangelize this world. Since most of us are not going to go off to a foreign country to tell the Good News we can at least support financially those who do. The Church has always been on mission ever since the beginning of the Church. The Holy Spirit continues to inspire us to proclaim Christ as the Way, the Truth, and the Life. And His grace enables us to be bold in the proclamation of our Catholic faith. Come Holy Spirit come and fill the hearts of your people so that we may give courageous witness to the person of Jesus Christ.

I recently ordered copies of a small publication called THE MAGNIFICENT PROMISE. This little booklet reminds us of a largely forgotten Fatima Devotion which for the past several years I have tried to promote. That forgotten devotion is the Five First Saturdays. I ordered enough copies for everyone and I would like to offer it to each of you to read and prayerfully consider doing. On the First Saturday of each month we start at 7:30 a.m. with the public recitation of the Holy Rosary. Then, at 8:00 a.m. we meditate with Mary on several mysteries of the rosary as our Lady has requested. And finally at 8:30 a.m. the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered in Latin at St. Sylvester's. Some of you might not appreciate the Latin Mass and that is understandable since we have been celebrating the new Mass now for about 53 years. But, I encourage you to give it a try. There is a nice publication called Benedictus which makes attending the Latin Mass easier as the readings and prayers are given in English alongside of the Latin. Let me know if you are interested in that publication. It costs me last year \$5.00 a month for a subscription. While the rosary and meditation is going on I will be available for confessions so that all of the requests of Our Lady can be fulfilled rather conveniently.

Here is another delightful story as told in the book JESUS, OUR EUCHARIS-TIC LOVE. "Blessed Francisco, one of the three small shepherds of Fatima, was a little contemplative, who had an ardent love for visiting the Blessed Sacrament. He wanted to go often and stay in church as long as he could in order to be near the tabernacle close to the "hidden Jesus", as he called the Eucharist in his childlike, profound way of speaking. When sickness confined him to bed, he confided to his cousin, Lucia, that his greatest pain was not being able to go visit the "hidden Jesus" so as to bring to Him all his kisses and his love. Here we have a little boy teaching us how to love!
