Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here we are at the end of another month. This year is quickly passing by. Soon we'll be in the season of Advent. Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. Christmas this year falls on a Monday. Looking ahead at that Feast we'll have Christmas Eve Mass at 5:00 p.m. at St. Sylvester's on December 24th which is a Sunday and then Christmas Day Masses at 8:30 a.m. at St. Sylvester's and 10:30 a.m. at St. John's. Christmas Eve in the morning we will have Masses to celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent. And so the Fourth week of Advent will last only for a day and then it will be Christmas!!

This week (November 26th – December 3rd) has a few changes in our regular Mass schedule. On Wednesday, November 29th we will have Eucharistic Adoration beginning at 8:00 a.m. and going until 6:00 p.m. as usual. I will be travelling up to Steubenville that morning to attend a special Memorial Mass for the priests who have died this year. Bishop Bradley has invited all of the priests to concelebrate the Mass at St. Peter's at 11:00 a.m. and have some lunch afterwards. I will be back in time to have Benediction at 6:00 p.m. followed by the Wednesday evening Mass at 6:30 p.m.

On Friday, December 1st (First Friday) we will have a school Mass at 8:30 a.m. and I will hear confessions of the children afterwards. In the evening at 6:00 p.m. we'll have a holy hour of reparation followed by Mass at 7:00 p.m. Then, on Saturday, December 2nd (First Saturday) we will have Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by a pot luck breakfast.

As we get ready to enter into Advent how should we live this special season? Advent is one of our two penitential seasons. It is not as severe as the Lenten season but still calls forth from us a generous spirit of penance and prayer. It is a season to be reconciled more completely with God and a season to enter more deeply into silence and prayer. All of this is for the purpose of preparing our hearts for the Feast of Christmas. We might try some fasting and attendance at daily Masses if possible. Our hearts can easily turn away from being centered in God and so Advent affords us four weeks of trying to return to the God Who was born of the Virgin Mary. It is important to consider Advent as a season of waiting patiently for the coming of the Lord and not get caught up in too much festive celebrating until Christmas is actually here. If we fail to do so we will have missed the importance of this season of preparation. There are special graces associated with living well each liturgical season and so I hope that we will each think of ways to live more deeply this holy season of Advent.

May God in His goodness assist each and every one of us to live our Christian life to the fullest.
