

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

Dear Parishioners,

I hope you all had a blessed Thanksgiving with family and friends.

Saint Paul says to us in our second reading today something that is of perennial importance, not just for Advent-time: "Brothers and sisters: you know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh (Romans 13:11-14)."

Jesus first coming in history was foretold by prophets long beforehand, and heralded by the appearance of a bright star. His second coming will be more sudden, as He Himself testifies to us today: "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come (Matt 24:44)."

Jesus calls for us to be alert, awake, and conscious. He wants disciples who are like watchmen, who not only wait faithfully and patiently for His coming, but are also able to rouse their friends and neighbors to watch for Christ's coming too.

The image of the watchman, the sentinel is one that appears in many places throughout scripture, especially the Old Testament. The Prophets warn us that we must be on the lookout: "Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel (Ezekiel 3:17)." "On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. You who put the Lord in remembrance, take no rest (Isaiah 62:6)." "For there shall be a day when watchmen will call in the hill country of Ephraim: 'Arise, and let us go up to Zion, to the Lord our God (Jeremiah 36:1)"

Are we awake enough to be able to receive Christ when he comes? Will he find us drowsy, still stuck in the same old sins? Will he find us asleep, dead and numb to the grace He has offered to us, unable to respond the promptings of His Spirit? Will he find us inattentive to the needs of our neighbor? Will he find us ignorant of the things that should not have escaped our attention?

We can curse the darkness of the world all we want. But Christ has made us His watchman in the world. He has entrusted us with the important task of keeping vigil, warding off evil, not succumbing to the forces of the night ourselves. How will we conduct our night shift? Will we find ourselves worthy to enjoy the rest which comes with the dawn of eternal life? Will God find us worthy?

I hope this Advent will allow us the chance to increase our awareness of things spiritual, so that neither Christ nor the Adversary will catch us unawares.
