Dear Beloved of God,

On this Sunday please welcome Bishop Monforton to the Church of St. John the Baptist in Miltonsburg. He will be celebrating the 10:30 a.m. Mass. We are happy to have our Bishop come for a visit. We pray in every Mass for our Bishop knowing that his work of governing the Diocese is not an easy one. Bishop has had to deal with the recent financial crisis in Steubenville and has done well in helping to resolve that crisis. He has also been dealing with the gradual decrease in population in our part of Ohio and the scarcity of vocations as well as the aging of the clergy. All these things must at times weigh heavily on his heart. He has to be a support to each of his priests and always seek the sanctification of the laity. And so let us continue to show our prayerful support of the one whom God has placed over us in our Diocese.

#### Thanksgiving After Mass

I think my guardian angel must be prompting me to remember that the time after Holy Communion is truly an ideal time to commune with Almighty God. Just having received the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ we are privileged "tabernacles" of His presence which remains in us for about 15 minutes. That is why that is a holy time, a time to remain conscious of God's goodness and mercy toward us. I like the story told about St. Phillip Neri. He was distressed by the fact that some people would leave the church as soon as they received Holy Communion or as soon as the Mass was over. St. Phillip Neri on one occasion instructed his altar boys with lighted candles to go and accompany a man who had left the church right after his Communion. The real presence of Jesus Christ was in that man and so St. Phillip Neri wanted to show the respect that should follow the reception of Holy Communion. He certainly would have frowned upon the loud talking and bantering that often marks the time after Mass even within some of our churches.

#### Veiling the Statues

As you can see the statues are now veiled from view giving us another sign that Lent is a time of sorrow for our sins. Even the joy of seeing the beautiful statues is now being removed from us. This Sunday marks the transition within the Lenten period and is called the beginning of "Passiontide" in which the Church reflects even more upon the suffering and death of her Lord and God. As you see the statues now covered perhaps you are aware that your sins helped to crucify the Lord and this is certainly the time to rid yourselves of such sins through making a good confession. The Church commands us to go to confession at least once a year during this season of Lent and Easter if we are conscious of having committed a mortal sin. I will be available from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. this coming Tuesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> at St. Sylvester's for confessions as well as after the Stations of the Cross this Friday, March 26<sup>th</sup> and of course on Saturday as usual from 4:00 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. I also hear confessions on Sundays before the Masses as time permits starting at 7:45 a.m. at St. Sylvester's.

#### The Solemnity of the Annunciation

This coming Thursday, March 25<sup>th</sup> is a Solemnity in the Church. It is the Feast of the Annunciation. It is also known as the Feast of the Incarnation since on this day our God took to Himself a human nature and became Man in the womb of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary. We will have two Masses to mark the occasion: at 9:00 a.m. at St. John's in Miltonsburg as on every Thursday and at 6:00 p.m. at St. Sylvester's. The 6:00 p.m. Mass will be a sung Latin Mass. We have some students coming from Morgantown in W.Va. to help with the singing and serving for that Mass and plan to have a pizza reception afterwards in the basement. I hope everyone attends one of these Masses to honor Jesus Christ the Son of God and the Son of Mary.

#### Saturday, March 27th Vigil of Palm Sunday

Saturday evening at 5:00 p.m. will mark the beginning of the Holy Week Liturgies. At the 5:00 p.m. Mass we will have the blessing of palms inside of the Church as well as the Passion Reading. This Mass is especially suited for those who might not want to participate in the Palm Sunday Procession tomorrow.

#### Holy Week

Palm Sunday, March 28th will be a special day for the Catholic communities of Monroe County in that we will all have an opportunity to worship together at the Palm Sunday Liturgy. The Liturgy will begin in the gym of the school at 9:00 a.m. Both entrances to the school will be unlocked. Following the blessing of palms and the reading of the first Gospel about Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem we will process out of the gym and through the cemetery to the Church. There will be no Liturgy at St. John's in Miltonsburg or at St. John's in Sardis that day. On Monday, March 29th the Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. at St. Sylvester's

On Tuesday, March 30th the Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. at St. John the Baptist. There will also be a Mass at St. Mary's Basilica at 5:00 p.m. in Marietta for the blessing of the holy oils. However, that Mass will involve only the priests and a few of the laity. On Wednesday, March 31st the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be held as usual beginning at 8:00 a.m. and going until 6:00 p.m. There will be Benediction at 6:00 p.m. followed by Mass at 6:30 p.m.

On Thursday, April 1st the Mass will only be held in the evening and it will be at 7:00 p.m. Again the whole Catholic community of Monroe County is invited to come together to celebrate the solemn Liturgy of Holy Thursday. However, the Foot Washing ceremony will not be held this year due to continuing concerns about the spread of the Covid-19 Virus.

On Friday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> there is no offering of Mass anywhere in the world. At noon at St. John's in Miltonsburg there will be Stations of the Cross and other prayers to mark Good Friday and in the evening at 7:00 p.m. at St. Sylvester's there will be the Liturgy of Good Friday with the reading of the Passion, veneration of the cross as well as reception of Holy Communion.

On Saturday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> at 8:00 p.m. there will be the Easter Vigil at St. Sylvester's. This year there is no one being baptized or received into the Church. But, the Liturgy will include various readings from the Old and New Testaments as well as a renewal of our baptismal promises. Those who attend the Vigil will not need to attend the Mass on Easter Sunday as the Vigil fulfils the obligation to assist at Mass.

On Sunday, April 4th Easter Masses will be celebrated at the usual times in each of the three Churches in Monroe County. The Easter Octave will then continue until the following Sunday in which the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. That Sunday, April 11th will be marked by a special service at 3:00 p.m. to sing the Divine Mercy Chaplet and adore Our Eucharistic Lord until 4:00 p.m. Please retain this bulletin so that you will be aware of the Holy Week services.
