Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this year of St. Joseph which started on December 8th, 2020 I decided to go through the preparation for my own consecration to this great saint. The preparation period begins next week on February 15th and ends on the Feast of St. Joseph, March 19th. There is a set of prayers and readings that one uses to prepare oneself for this consecration. I am sure that one can find the appropriate resources on line. Someone gave me the book to prepare myself as a Christmas gift and so I decided to do the consecration especially since this year is dedicated to St. Joseph in a special way. My own devotion to this great saint has been growing for the past ten years or so ever since I started asking for his powerful intercession in my work in Tulsa, Oklahoma. I was working in an immigrant community and we didn't have many resources. We had an inner city school and there were many times when we needed a new boiler or a new roof or a construction project to benefit the school or parish and we really didn't have the money. But, every time that we prayed to St. Joseph the money always came somehow or other. I would recommend that this year we each consider perhaps consecrating ourselves to St. Joseph or at least deepening our trust and devotion to him in some way. The story of St. Andre Bessette CSC from Canada is a fascinating account of one man's truly inspiring story of how St. Joseph helped in the miraculous cures of hundreds of people. The basilica in Montreal dedicated to St. Joseph is an amazing testimony to St. Andre's great love for St. Joseph. It is a great place to go on pilgrimage. If you are looking for something to read please consider picking up a biography of St. Andre Bessette and I think you will be very much encouraged to love good St. Joseph even more.

On this theme of consecrations, there are several parishioners who have been making the preparation to be consecrated to Our Lady and the day of their consecration is February 11th, the Feast of Our lady of Lourdes and World Day of the Sick. They have been preparing for this consecration over the past month and are going to come together at 5:30 p.m. on February 11th to pray the rosary and make their total consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary. If anyone else would like to make the preparation in a similar way I have some books that you can use to help you prepare. You can select a particular Feast Day of Our Lady and then count 33 days before the Feast as the date to start your preparation. Just let me know if you are interested and I will give you the necessary book.

Speaking of the World Day of the Sick has reminded me to let you know that once a month I have been seeing our shut-ins. Unfortunately for the past couple of months I haven't been able to go to the nursing homes because of the shut-downs but as soon as I am able to resume my visits there I will do so. In the meantime, I am getting more organized in visiting our shut -ins and this week in which February 11th World Day of the Sick falls I will arrange to visit all those who are not able to come to the church. Please keep our shut-ins in your prayers and all those who are locked away in the nursing homes. If anyone would like to send a card to any of them please let me know and I can get you the address if you need it.

This coming Saturday, Feb. 13th, I'll be down in Gallipolis, Ohio baptizing one of my great nephews and so we won't have the usual 8:30 a.m. Latin Mass at St. Sylvester's that day.

Please start preparing yourselves for the Lenten season which begins on Wednesday, February 17th. Our Mass schedule for that day will be in the bulletin next Sunday.


