Dear Friends in Christ,

This third week of August is "Fair Week". I hope to see some of our families enjoying some time together there. This Sunday is also the Sunday when I have the traditional Latin Mass at 4:00 p.m. in Triadelphia, W.Va. I am thinking about offering the Latin Traditional Mass twice a month there instead of once a month. There is quite a lot of interest in the Latin Mass in the Wheeling area and the Latin Mass Society of Wheeling asked me specifically if I would be willing to offer it for those who desire it. Of course, people come from all over to attend the Latin Mass and so I am thinking that perhaps I should offer it at least twice in a month.

At St. John's we are trying to decide whether or not it is feasible to rent the Hall for outside groups. Any young adult is welcomed whether married or single. It would perhaps be a good idea to email Julian if you are planning to attend in the event that the group wants to order some food. St. Cyril of Alexandria, Father and Doctor of the Church wrote: "If the poison of pride swells up in you, turn to the Eucharist, and that Bread, which is your God humbling and disguising Himself, will teach you humility. If the fever of selfish greed rages in you, feed on this Bread; and you will learn generosity. If the cold wind of selfishness and self-interest saddens you, hasten to the Bread of angels; and charity will come to blossom in your heart. If you feel the itch of intemperance, nourish yourself with the Flesh and Blood of Christ, who practiced heroic self-control during His earthly life; and you will become temperate. If you are lazy and sluggish about spiritual things, strengthen yourself with this Heavenly Food; and you will grow fervent. Lastly, if you feel scorched by the fever of impurity, go to the Banquet of the angels; and the Immaculate Flesh of Christ will make you pure and chaste."
