National Catholic School Week

The National Catholic Schools week begins this week and St. Sylvester's school will be participating in this annual event. There will be various activities each day in the school including a visit by Bishop Monforton on Wednesday. He will celebrate the 8:30 a.m. Mass that day and then go and visit the school. Everyone is welcome to attend the Mass and show support for our school. After the Mass I will expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration. That will be about 9:30 a.m.

Thursday, February 2nd: Feast of the Presentation

On Thursday instead of having Mass at St. John's I'll be having Mass at St. Sylvester's with the school children and anyone else who wants to attend. The first part of the ceremony will actually start in the school building at 8:30 a.m. with the blessing of candles. Then, there will be a procession with all the children across the parking lot to the Church for the Mass. The older children will be carrying candles and there will be a box at the front doors to deposit the candles before entering the church. This will help with the clean-up because candles can be rather messy and it is not easy to get the wax off the pews and carpet.

Friday, February 3rd: Feast of St. Blaise

On Friday, February 3rd there will be another school Mass at 8:30 a.m. with the traditional blessing of throats after the homily. Again everyone is welcome to attend.

Brothers and Sisters of the Alliance of the Two Hearts

There will be two religious brothers, three religious sisters, and two other young people coming from Alabama to be with us during the Catholic Schools' Week. This special team will arrive on Wednesday evening after driving from Alabama and will stay through Sunday, February 5th. They will participate in the school activities on Thursday and Friday and will assist at the Liturgies. They are also available to visit anyone's home who would like to have their family consecrated to the two Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Just call me if you are interested in having the team come to your house.

Latin sung Mass on Thursday, February 2nd at 4:00 p.m.

Everyone is invited to attend a Latin sung Mass of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary to be celebrated at St. Sylvester's at 4:00 p.m. There will be the traditional blessing of candles and a short procession before the Mass begins. Anyone may bring candles to be blessed. Arrive a little early so that the candles can be placed on the appropriate table before Mass. The team coming from Alabama will assist with the Liturgy that day as singers and servers.

First Friday and First Saturday

As has been our custom for some time now we will be honoring Our Blessed Lord's Sacred Heart and Our Lady's Immaculate Heart this coming Friday and Saturday as they have requested. On Friday there will be both a morning Mass with the school as noted above and also a Mass in the evening starting at 7:00 p.m. However, before the evening Mass there will also be a rosary at 6:30 p.m. After the Mass there will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and a time of prayer in union with the holy angels in which the Sacred Heart is honored and the Blessed Sacrament adored. I hope you all will come. And then on Saturday, February 4th there will be a rosary at 7:30 a.m. followed by a guided meditation at 8:00 a.m. and then the holy Mass at 8:30 a.m. The rosary and Mass will be prayed in Latin. Whenever anyone participates in the Latin traditional Mass and receives Holy Communion it must be done at the altar rail while kneeling, if possible and on the tongue. We follow the 1962 rite which did not allow Communion in the hand. After Mass there will be a potluck breakfast in the basement of St. Sylvester's. Have a good week everyone!!
