

Dear Parishioners,

With Christmas rapidly approaching, we have come to the third Sunday of Advent called "Gaudete Sunday," the "Sunday of Rejoicing" or "Rose Sunday."

The holidays always bring for us a flurry of emotions. Children look forward to Christmas Day with rapturous glee and excitement. But there are also those among us for whom Christmas is a bittersweet time, recounting pain and loss, encountering loneliness and heartbreak. The many wounds and losses of life can haunt us aggressively in this time when we would much rather be joyful. Dare we hope to experience joy again in this world where we have known losses and pain and sadness? Let's not forget those for whom the holidays present a financial burden, and also those who have to work during the holidays against their will. Where's the joy for them?

Even in the hardships of life however we can find peace and joy. This is achieved when we more closely unite ourselves together with God, who meets us on the cross of suffering. Jesus came to earth to share our sorrows as well as our joys. Jesus, our consoler, came among us into the darkness of the world in the midst of its pains and hardships, "sharing our sorrows, knowing our hunger" as the popular hymn (*Child of the Poor*) goes. Jesus comes to share our burdens to show us an example of what we also must do to transcend suffering. Jesus, who suffered among us, suffers for us. Like Jesus, even though we are in pain, helping others in their own suffering is one way we can alleviate our own.

We can find joy in sharing Christ's cross – and the crosses of others. Pope Benedict XVI in *The Joy of Giving to Others* stated: "Men and women of every age and social condition, happy to dedicate their existence to others, give us the answer with their lives! Was not [St.] Mother Teresa of Calcutta an unforgettable witness of true Gospel joy in our time? She lived in touch daily with wretchedness, human degradation and death. Her soul knew the trials of the dark night of faith, yet she gave everyone God's smile. In one of her writings, we read: "We wait impatiently for paradise, where God is, but it is in our power to be in paradise even here on earth and from this moment. Being happy with God means loving like him, helping like him, giving like him, serving like him"

When we help others in their pain, we can more easily be healed. This time of year, which provides an excellent opportunity for charitable giving and outreach, may be more than just an opportunity for a tax write-off, but an opportunity to encounter the healing power of Christ in our suffering brothers and sisters. Visiting a lonely shut-in, calling an old friend who lost a spouse, comforting the sick... there are so very many opportunities to visit our brethren with Christ's joy, and therefore plenty of opportunities to be gladdened by the experience of being Christ to others.
