

Dear Parishioners,

Happy World Mission Sunday. This weekend, the Church throughout the world is focused on aiding and assisting, especially through almsgiving, the Church's mission to those areas of the world where the Gospel needs to be preached and the Church needs to be established, especially those areas which are poorer and more remote.

I encourage you to participate in the Dioceses' annual collection to support the missions. But I want to invite you to think of our parishes as a sort of mission as well. After all, we are in "mission territory": The Diocese of Steubenville is a Mission Diocese, which means it is poorer than most US dioceses and the population is mostly non-Catholic. In fact, we Catholics make up a small percentage of the population of this county as a whole. According to the most recent census data, approximately half of the residents of our county don't consider themselves an adherent to any religion – in other words, they are practitioners of "practical atheism." This is about 15% less than the Ohio state average. Of the 6,000 residents of our County who practice or profess to practice some religion, only small percentage identify as Catholic, and of these, only about 200 make it to Mass on the weekend (that is, 200 people actualize their belief in God into worship and love of Him). This would bring our number of active Catholics to about 230, to include the sick and home-bound. That would mean that less than 2% of the county, or 1 in 50, are members of the Church, worship God, and seek to grow in a loving union with Him.

We can despair at these numbers, or we can redouble our efforts. My friends in Christ! Your opportunity to be a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ has never been higher! Unlike St. Francis Xavier, you don't need to travel to India or Japan to find unbelievers. You are surrounded by them! Like St. Francis DeSales, who left his native Savoy to become Bishop of Geneva Switzerland (which was then and is now Protestant territory), you also have an opportunity to witness to your protestant-heretic neighbors and share the true teaching of Christ's One, Holy, and Apostolic Catholic Church.

Similarly, you don't have to go to Calcutta like Mother Theresa to find the poor. Out of 88 Ohio Counties, Monroe County ranks as the 8th poorest. The poor are all around us! And, in fact, the Church in Monroe County is poor as well. Our little mission parishes have been struggling. I appreciate, deeply, those of you who have increased your offertory gifts and have participated in our drive to make our parishes more financially stable. But it remains that only 15% of our parishioners have responded. Please, 85%, join us in supporting our poor little churches!

I exhort you, my beloved 85%, in the words of Pope Leo XIV, whose first Apostolic Exhortation, "Dilexi Te," speaks of the importance of giving: "Our love and our deepest convictions need to be continually cultivated, and we do so through our concrete actions. Remaining in the realm of ideas and theories, while failing to give them expression through frequent and practical acts of charity, will eventually cause even our most cherished hopes and aspirations to weaken and fade away. For this very reason, we Christians must not abandon almsgiving. It can be done in different ways, and surely more effectively, but it must continue to be done. It is always better at least to do something rather than nothing."

Love needs to be manifested in action. If you love God, and love the Church, please allow these affections be demonstrated in your actions.
