

Dear Friends in Christ,

Here we are in the middle of November already!! And this Sunday is called STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY. Christian stewardship is really a way of life as you know. We are not just stewards of the gifts God gives us once a year on Stewardship Sunday but always and every day. As I said stewardship is a way of life. What does it mean though?

Being stewards means that first and foremost we recognize that God is the giver of all good gifts. Everything belongs to God and we are only the stewards who try to use the gifts God bestows in a responsible and intelligent way. God Himself has made us stewards as we read in the Book of Genesis. We think of stewardship as pertaining to our money but it is much more than that. Stewardship also involves our time and our talents. God has entrusted to us a certain amount of time to spend here on earth before we face our eternal destiny. He wants us to use this limited amount of time to the best of our ability. Wasting time is not what He wants. Time is precious. How are we using this great gift? That is a question that we should ask ourselves today on this STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY. And also what talents has God bestowed upon us in His great mercy and love? Are we using those talents to benefit others and to increase God's glory? Or are we squandering these talents on ourselves? And finally we should ask ourselves if we are giving back to God in gratitude the monetary gifts bestowed upon us to help build up the Church and assist those who are in need? God expects us to be generous distributors of His manifold gifts and not count the cost. How generous are we with our time, talents, and money? This is a good time to reflect on these things as we approach Thanksgiving Day next week.

We have a Finance Meeting on Tuesday of this week. As we reflect on our practice of stewardship we might consider whether we are giving the same amount we have given for years and years or whether we are increasing our gift. As we all know things are constantly increasing in cost. The price of electric, gas, water, maintenance, salaries etc. etc. all keep increasing. To keep up with this increasing cost of living perhaps we need to try to give even more than we have been giving especially if we haven't increased our giving for years and years. One example of the increase in costs is the price of the vigil candles that we use in both of our churches. We spend hundreds of dollars every time we have to buy more of these candles. As you may have noticed we now have to ask at least \$3.00 per candle when lighting one of these vigil candles.

Our Mass and adoration schedule is normal this week. Please consider spending some of the time God gives you in attending daily Mass and making a holy hour on Wednesday during the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. There are so many things to pray for these days and hanging on to our faith is not too easy. Let us pray for each other and let us pray in thanksgiving to God for entrusting to us the stewardship of the gifts of time, talents, and treasure.
